- **Brief overview of health economics teaching activities**

I have developed an elective on health economics in the flagship MBA program at IIM Bangalore that I have been running since 2011. It has been subscribed in most years and this year we had three sections of this elective, i.e. a total of 225 students!

Overtime, the course has evolved from a standard Health Economics course in an economics department to one that seeks to look at understanding business organizations and how their operations must change in response to the complexities of the health sector. We have experimented with the design of organizations to fill gaps in healthcare delivery in India, and how the firms would run if they operated if these organizations had a “health” motive apart from a profit motive.
