The Department of International Health at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health is hosting a <u>Global Health Systems Summer Institute</u> on **May 28** through **August 2**, **2024.** The Institute is a great opportunity for early- to mid-career public health professionals to expand their skill sets and improve job performance.

Four health economics courses are offered:


