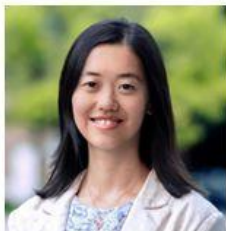

IHEA Call for Abstracts review for Early Career Researchers in Low- and Middle-Income Countries

The abstract submissions for the 2025 IHEA World Congress on Health Economics - Bali (Indonesia) opened in mid-August 2024 and will close on November 19th, 2024.

IHEA will once again be offering support to early career researchers (ECRs) in low- and middle- income countries (LMICs) who do not have access to senior colleagues at their institution. LMIC ECRs are able to submit a draft abstract by **September 26th 2024**, for review and detailed feedback on how to improve the abstract. A team of established health economists will review each abstract and provide detailed feedback on how the abstract can be improved by late October, to allow researchers to finalise and submit their abstracts before the submission deadline of **November 19th 2024**.

The Economics of Digital Health Technology SIG is committed to supporting the review of draft abstracts from ECRs and providing feedback.

Abstracts for review should be submitted via the central IHEA [form](#). These will then be allocated to us based on the theme.
